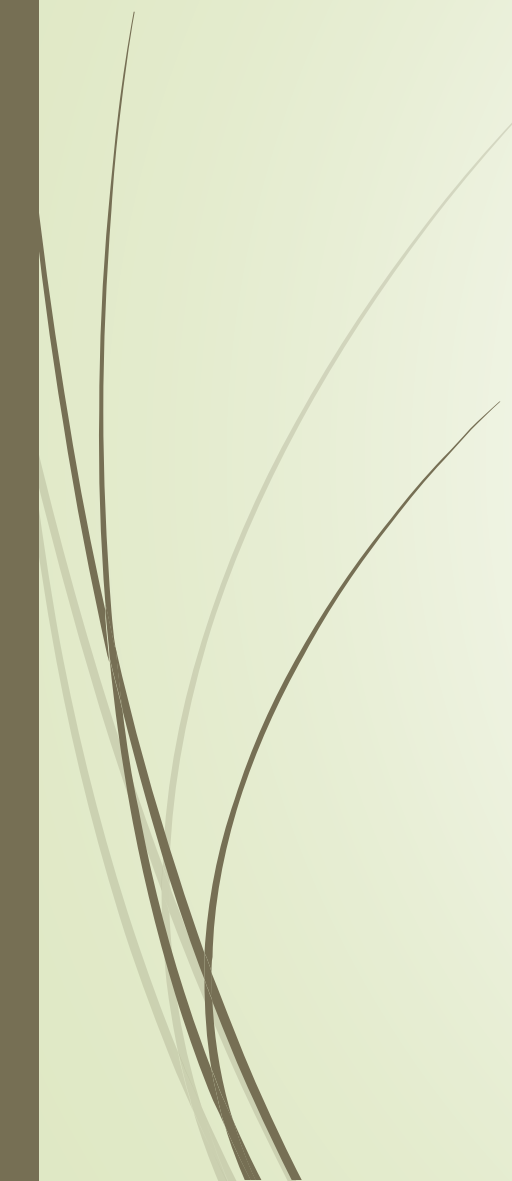



## GALATIANS 6:3-5

<sup>3</sup> If anyone thinks they are something when they are not, they deceive themselves.

<sup>4</sup> Each one should test their own actions. Then they can take pride in themselves alone, without comparing themselves to someone else,

<sup>5</sup> **for each one should carry their own load.**
